He has co-authored numerous studies for CSIS (including the Aging Vulnerability Index and pioneering studies on pension reform in China and South Korea).

Howe and Strauss' first book, *Generations* (1991) is a history of America told as a sequence of generational biographies. *Generations*, said Newsweek, is "a provocative, erudite, and engaging analysis of the rhythms of American life."
